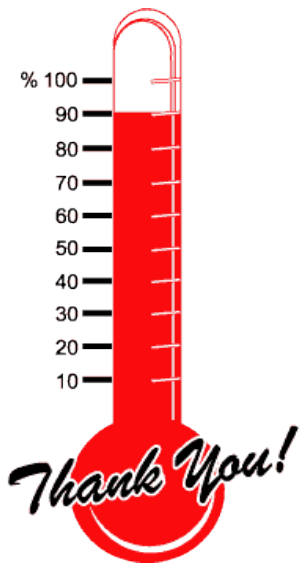




## Almost there - but not yet!!

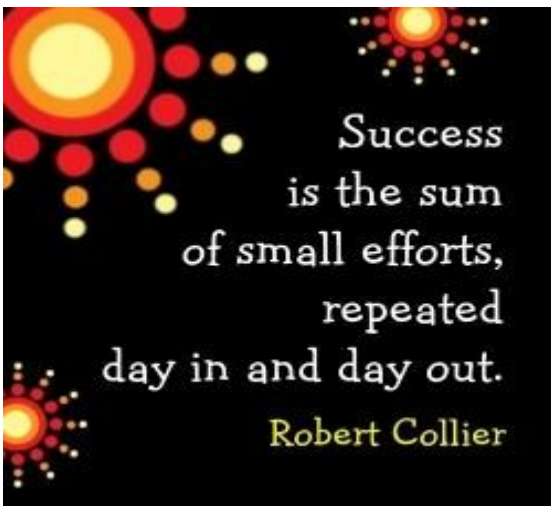

# Success Story

CARDV filed Orders of Protection for a client and her fiancé that were being stalked and terrorized by an ex-boyfriend. This man had shot out the tires on their vehicle and the lights on the front porch of their home. An advocate from CARDV went to court and saw

them through the process to Full Orders of Protection. We continued to meet with them to work on safety planning as well as how to cope with growing stress and anxiety.

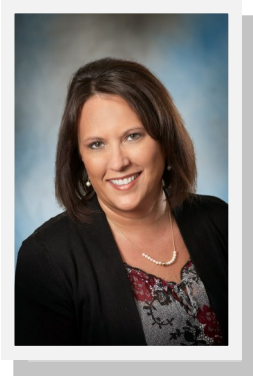
The perpetrator, in this case, subsequently had several pending criminal charges. Pursuing criminal charges can be a long and exhausting process. We continued to support and advocate for our clients with Law Enforcement and the Prosecuting Attorney's office while this case worked its way through the criminal justice system. CARDV was able to provide resources, as well as emotional support, which boosted the clients' resilience and helped them stay afloat through an immensely stressful time.

Months later the perpetrator was arrested and jailed and CARDV continued to provide court advocacy. The support and healing they were offered throughout this process strengthened them when giving their victim impact statements at his trial, which was additionally healing for them. The emotional and psychological support that CARDV provided helped them survive their victimization and allowed a successful journey through the criminal justice system.

This is just one example of many agency success stories. The Callaway County United Way agencies all work together so that the most people can be helped with the resources available. 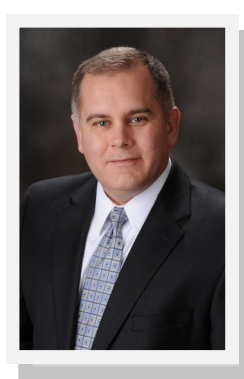


## Two new faces join the CCUW Board
